

Impact of sports premium 2014 - 2015

The sports premium funding has enabled us to bring in a new PE curriculum that has helped teachers this year, and will continue to aid teachers with planning for next year with the new curriculum.

A new set of indoor, athletics competition equipment was bought so that indoor athletics could be brought into the curriculum which, in turn, helped when we participated in the Redbridge Mini Games Athletics.

We invested in both a handball coach and a dodgeball coach that gave the children an opportunity to play sports that they might not have had before, and also provided an excellent chance for some team teaching to up-skill teachers. At the Redbridge Mini games, the handball team that entered won the tournament. We also competed in tennis, hockey and basketball.

We have also bought a new set of sports day equipment allowing for a successful competitive sports day enjoyed by all.
