IMPACT OF SPORTS PREMIUM 2015 - 2016

The sports premium funding has enabled us to bring in a new PE curriculum that has helped teachers in their delivery of effective teaching this year, and which will continue to aid teachers with their planning for subsequent years meeting the guidelines of the new curriculum.

We have used the money to develop skills for both NQT's and leadership within P.E.

We have invested in both a handball coach and a Key Stage One Coach that provided children with the opportunity to play new sports that they might not have encountered before, and also provided ways to cater for some teamteaching to up-skill teachers and enhance their continued professional development. At the Redbridge Mini games we competed in Athletics, WSR, Tennis, Hockey, Football and Basketball.

We have also bought more sports day equipment, which provided the tools to achieve a successful competitive sports day which was enjoyed by all.

Due to the ring-fenced funding, we were able to take a year 5/6 girls football team to a football tournament organised by Redbridge, in which they were runners up, leading to a

further invitation to participate in a tournament involving the best teams in Essex; a great opportunity for our girls!
