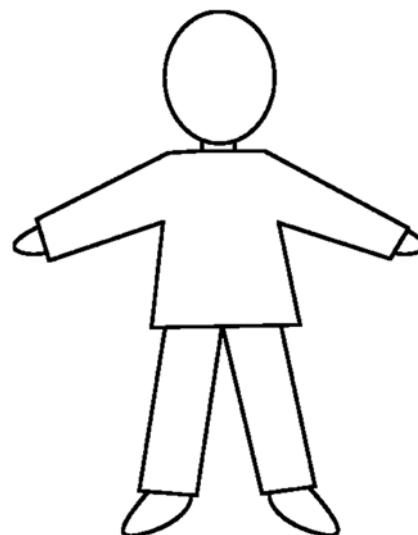


# Pupil Premium Provision Map 2016-17

The pupil premium grant is additional money provided to schools to enable them to support those pupils who are considered disadvantaged. The chosen measure is the entitlement of Free School Meals within the last 6 years. The funding for this year is based on pupil numbers from the previous academic year and in 2016-17 is £57,920 for 50 pupils. The following diagrams show how this has been spent and the impact upon those children.

**Blue - Enrichment/engagement**  
**Yellow = Well being**



## Interventions

**Overview:** In class support, offering individualised support and challenge to HA and LA pupils

**Cost** £17,096

**Aim/Outcome:** To accelerate progress in all subjects across all year groups, fostering pupil-lead approaches to learning

## Pupil Premium Champion and Inclusion Lead targeted support

**Overview:** Senior leadership focus on pupil premium pupils to ensure support is targeted

**Cost** £7,371

**Aim/Outcome:** DHT assessing data and measuring impact- ensuring targeted support. Inclusion Lead providing 1:1 support for individual pupils who most benefit from guidance and nurturing

## Closing the gap

**Overview:** Teaching by specialists to close the gap in achievement between PP and non PP pupils

**Cost** £19,514

**Aim/Outcome:** Specialist Maths and English support provided by HLTAs

## Booster classes

**Overview:** Targeting of pupils who are at risk of not achieving their potential

**Cost** £1,109

**Aim/Outcome:** Additional intensive support before school day starts to improve outcomes for those at risk of not achieving age-expected outcomes in end of key stage results

## Targeted resources

**Overview:** Use of specific interventions to improve outcomes for the most disadvantaged pupils

**Cost** £950

**Aim/Outcome:** Toe-by-Toe (for weaker readers), comprehension and phonics schemes, Read Write Inc additional resources
