Pupil Premium Provision Map 2016-17

The pupil premium grant is additional money provided to schools to enable them to support those pupils who are considered disadvantaged.

The chosen measure is the entitlement of Free School Meals within the last 6 years. The funding for this year is based on pupil numbers from the previous academic year and in 2016-17 is £57,920 for 50 pupils. The following diagrams show how this has been spent and the impact upon those children.


