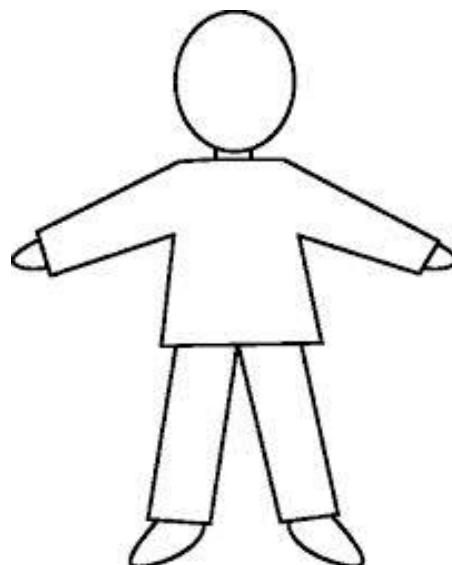


# Pupil Premium Provision Map 2016-17

The pupil premium grant is additional money provided to schools to enable them to support those pupils who are considered disadvantaged. The chosen measure is the entitlement of Free School Meals within the last 6 years. The funding for this year is based on pupil numbers from the previous academic year and in 2016-17 is £57,920 for 50 pupils. The following diagrams show how this has been spent and the impact upon those children.

**Blue - Enrichment/engagement**  
**Yellow = Well being**



## Extra-curricular sports clubs

**Overview:** Money available to support children in their choice of after-school sports clubs

**Cost** £450

**Aim/Outcome:** Providing a range of opportunities and equality of access for all children promotes a healthy and active lifestyle

## Out of school hours learning (OOSHL)

**Overview:** Supporting pupils lacking in confidence and self-esteem by providing alternative learning experiences, outside the classroom

**Cost** £195

**Aim/Outcome:** Pupils benefitting from OOSHL are more confident and better equipped to deal with potentially challenging situations at home

## Subsidised trips

**Overview:** Subsidised school and residential trips to ensure access for all pupils

**Cost** £392.25

**Aim/Outcome:** Attendance at Kingswood (year 6), Skeet (years 5 & 6) and Stubbers (years 3 & 4) offers a broad range of practical and holistic opportunities for pupils to experience

## Cookery classes

**Overview:** Targeted 1:1 work with specific pupils to improve confidence and learning outcomes through holistic, enrichment activities

**Cost** £1,000

**Aim/Outcome:** Weekly cookery activities provided in school to offer life skills and more vocational support to a pupil
