

Pupil Premium Provision Map 2017-18

The pupil premium grant is additional money provided to schools to enable them to support those pupils who are considered disadvantaged. The chosen measure is the entitlement of Free School Meals within the last 6 years. The funding for this year is based on pupil numbers from the previous academic year and in 2017-18 is £67,900 for 35 pupils. The following diagrams show how this will be spent in the coming year and the intended outcome and impact for those children.

Green = Academic
Blue - Enrichment/engagement
Yellow = Well being

Pastoral care

Overview: Wrap-around care for pupils and their families to support emotional and pastoral needs

Cost to be advised

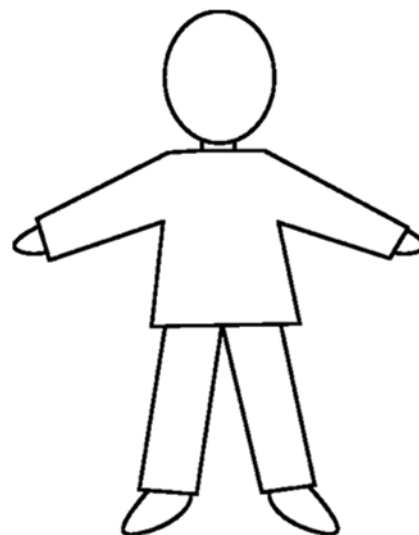
Aim/Outcome: DHT and Inclusion lead time plus outside agencies (NRH and Hatton outreach) helping to support emotional resilience

Norwood counselling

Overview: Supporting vulnerable pupils to deal with any issues which might be affecting them – at home or in school

Cost to be advised

Aim/Outcome: 1:1 counselling service during the school day for pupils needing emotional support. Individuals work towards strategies to cope with issues which might be worrying or affecting them. Half-termly meetings with SLT regarding in-school support of these pupils



Education Welfare Officer

Overview: Supporting families and pupils in improving attendance

Cost to be advised

Aim/Outcome: Fortnightly meetings with attendance officer and DHT to monitor and pre-empt support for disadvantages families whose attendance and/or parenting is a cause for concern

Free milk

Overview: Promoting healthy eating and focus in class

Cost 22p per day – total to be advised

Aim/Outcome: All pupils eligible for pupil premium are offered milk at break time, regardless of their age or year group

Nearly new uniform scheme

Overview: Promoting a sense of well-being and belonging to all pupils in the school community

Cost to be advised

Aim/Outcome: Provision of items of uniform for those in need
