- Be an ambassador for the school; celebrating success and achievement.

The School will strive to:

- Promote a Jewish ethos.
- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum and meet the needs of the individual child.
- Provide a safe and stimulating environment through good teaching in which pupils are motivated to learn so that they achieve high standards and maximise their potential.
- Develop independence and confidence as individuals and a desire to strive for success.
- Encourage pupils to value themselves and others, recognising their own strengths and areas of development.
- Provide opportunities for pupils to broaden their horizons and develop their awareness of the wider world.
- Set clear and achievable targets, share them and discuss their child's progress with parents during parents' evenings and in an annual report.
- Set, mark and monitor homework which will benefit pupils educationally whilst reinforcing and furthering the content of lessons.
- Involve parents with any concerns and problems that affect their child's work or behaviour.
- Contact parents if there is a problem with attendance or punctuality, uniform or equipment. Encourage trust, self-respect, honesty and the confidence to take responsibility for the child's actions.
- Keep parents informed about school activities through the school website, newsletters and appropriate letters.
