Our Choir were honoured and privileged to sing at the Yom Hashoah Ceremony at The Holocaust Memorial, The Dell, Hyde Park. Together with 50 pupils from other London Jewish Primary Schools, our choir sang 'Never Again' and 'Oseh Shalom' in the presence of Holocaust Survivors and their families, Mayor of London Sadig Khan and the Chief Rabbi, Ephraim Mirvis. We remembered the six million lewish women, men and children who were murdered in the Holocaust.

We reminded the pupils of the sobering thought, that if we held one minute of silence for every one of the six million victims of the Holocaust, we would be silent for eleven and a half years.







Generation Sinai

Once again, Generation Sinai was a huge success as parents came together with children for our pre-Shavuot learning programme.
